

Did you know that over 40% of visually impaired people have a secondary disability?

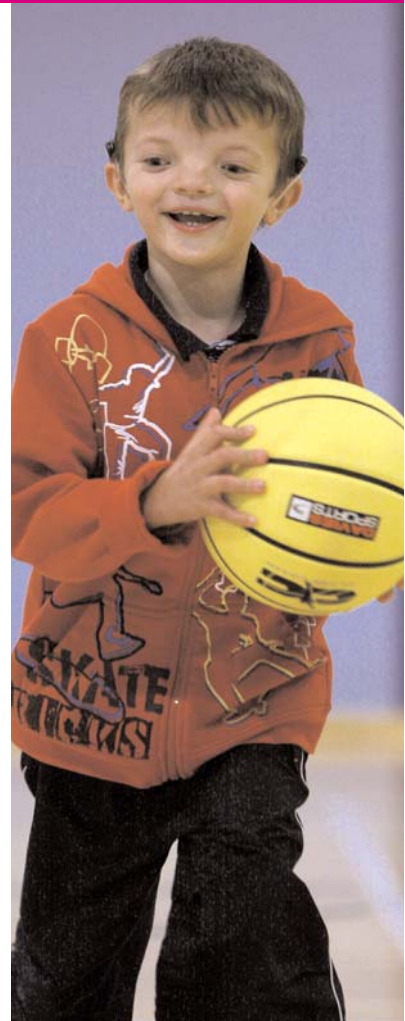
You can make a difference. Help break down the barriers that prevent young people with a visual impairment and other disabilities from taking part in sport.

Our high quality courses combine practical demonstrations and presentations covering communication and motivation skills. Attendees will gain an understanding of how to:-

- ◆ ensure that young visually impaired people and those with secondary disabilities, have equal opportunities to be involved in sport
- ◆ promote physical activities which can help tackle health related issues such as obesity, diabetes and premature heart disease
- ◆ ensure that all sports for disabled, blind and partially sighted young people are played in a safe and fun environment
- ◆ encourage more visually impaired young people and those with secondary disabilities to take part in sporting activities and ensure that friends and relations of those children can participate together
